
## **Frequently Asked Questions**

### I'm unable to visit the Windrock Park General Store in person. Is this book sold online?

No, unfortunately the book is only available through Windrock Park General Store. However, if you call the store at the number listed on <u>Windrock Park's</u> <u>website</u>, you should be able to purchase the book over the phone and have it shipped to you.



#### How much does the book cost, and do you receive a percentage of each sale?

Last I heard, the book was selling for about \$37, but you'd need to contact Windrock Park General Store to confirm this. And I was paid a flat fee for my research and writing; so, no royalties.

#### Is this book available as an audio book or other format?

No, the book was only distributed in print as a hardcover book.

#### Can you share a PDF of the book?

No, the publisher has not authorized me to sell or share a PDF of the book.

#### Can the book be found in other places?

<u>Knox County (TN) Public Library</u> holds a non-circulating copy of the book at its McClung Collection branch, and I believe the <u>Oliver Springs Historical Society</u> and <u>Coal Creek Miners Museum</u> each own a copy as well. Readers that enjoyed the book might consider gifting a copy to their local library.
